The Eighth FMIC Annual International Scientific Conference will be held at French Medical Institute for Mothers and Children on Saturday, 4th August, 2018. This is an annual event that is organized regularly. The theme for this year conference is “Better health: reaching everyone, everywhere” which is extracted from the theme for this year’s World Health Day that is “Universal health coverage: everyone, everywhere”. The conference will discuss multiple subjects on clinical, population & public health and academic related topics in the plenary and concurrent sessions.

Universal Health Coverage (UHC) is vital to ensure quality health services to all people every time, everywhere and it draws attention towards health issues around the globe. UHC emphasizes on access to a wide range of quality health services from promotion to prevention, treatment, rehabilitation and palliative care. It also focuses on out of pocket expenditure reduction, long-term economic development, enhancing research and development, strengthening capacity of all countries to make good progress towards other health related targets and initiating strategies to reach UHC as part of Sustainable Development Goals by the year 2030.

The Eighth FMIC Annual International Scientific Conference will provide a platform for researchers, scientists, academicians, government officials, policy makers, physicians, nurses, sociologists, journalists and others around the world who are keen to discuss issues and measures related to better health to reach everyone, everywhere to promote well-being. The conference will comprise; clinical, population & public health and academic perspectives to look at the current trends and practices worldwide.

- Quality and Patient Safety
- Nursing, Midwifery Care and Allied services

For abstract submission, please note the following:

- Abstracts for the Conference will be selected for oral or poster presentation depending on the evaluation by Scientific Committee.
- Authors should also specify their preference of oral or poster presentation.
- The selection of abstracts will follow strict appraisal to ensure that only quality abstracts are presented at the Conference.
- Please clearly state the subtheme while submitting your abstracts.
- Follow the “Guidelines for Abstract Submission” for complete details as given below.

Abstracts Submission Guidelines

For abstract submission please note:

- Abstracts for the Conference will be selected for oral or poster presentation depending on the evaluation by the Scientific Committee.
- The selection of abstracts for oral presentation will follow strict appraisal to ensure that only quality abstracts are presented at the Conference.
- Registration to the Conference is mandatory for final acceptance of abstracts.

Submit your abstracts through:

- The abstract will be accepted in soft copy only through e-mail. Hardcopies sent by mail or fax will not be considered.
- No changes in the abstract contents and the authorship will be allowed after the final submission. If you wish to withdraw your abstract you must inform the Scientific Committee via e-mail before July 15, 2018.
- The submitted abstract should be original
- Abstracts must be submitted in English language only.
- Abstracts must not exceed more than 350 words, including title, author/s, affiliations and footnotes.

Following subheadings should be used in all abstracts:

- ✓ **Objective/s:** a sentence describing the significance and objective/ question of study
 - ✓ **Methodology:** description of materials and methods employed in the study
 - ✓ **Results:** description of key results in a logical sequence
 - ✓ **Conclusion:** emphasis on important aspects of the study, recommendations/ policy implications.
- Those who submit research abstracts will be notified regarding the acceptance / rejection approximately 30 days ahead of the conference. If accepted, the notification will include the date and time of the session / presentation.
 - The title should be clearly formulated, indicating the nature of the study. Please do not use abbreviations in the title.
 - Use "Times New Roman" size 12 and single line spacing for the abstract text.
 - Please check the spelling and grammar carefully. The abstract will be retrieved from your online submission - any errors in spelling, grammar or scientific data will appear in print.
 - Accepted abstracts will be published in the Abstract Book
